He is an avid plein air painter, being inspired by and painting the majority of his works on location. This has helped him develop a confident style with an immediacy and freshness infused into each painting.




Don Andrews Workshop

The Don Andrews workshop was held via ZOOM on February 24th in a paint along format. The subject was the seascape shown in the photograph at right.


Don first gave a demonstration on value and shapes and how they are used to create a strong focal point using the area of highest contrast.



He then proceeded to guide his audience through the painting process by building layers of transparent color from the light values to medium to dark.



The workshop was very successful, it ran smoothly and was thoroughly enjoyed by the participants.
